# Report for Animal Birth Control and Anti-Rabies Vaccination Program for Community Dogs (2024-25)



The Blue Cross of Hyderabad systematically implements the Animal Birth Control (ABC) and Anti-Rabies Vaccination (ARV) programs across multiple municipalities. These initiatives are active in 3 Municipalities in the Hyderabad and Secunderabad Districts, 13 Municipalities in the Medchal-Malkajgiri District, 8 Municipalities in the Ranga Reddy District, as well as 1 Municipality each in the Sangareddy District and the Medak District.







To ensure the effectiveness of the ABC program, a rapid response team is deployed to swiftly capture and isolate dogs reported for bite incidents. These dogs are immediately quarantined for rabies observation, thereby enhancing community safety and protection. If Rabies is identified – post bite vaccination is aggressively conducted; Institute of Preventive Medicine and A.H. Department, GHMC are informed of the location from where Rabies case was confirmed. This proactive strategy not only reassures residents but also fosters confidence in the program while promoting compassion toward protected street dogs within the area.



# OUTREACH AND EDUCATION PROGRAMMES:

## SECUNDERABAD AWARENESS DRIVE & WATER BOWL DISTRIBUTION

As part of our community outreach initiative, Blue Cross of Hyderabad conducted a series of awareness programs across the Secunderabad region. The goal was to sensitize the public on animal welfare issues, especially during the summer months when street animals struggle to find clean drinking water. Along with informative sessions and interaction with locals, we distributed water bowls to households, shopkeepers, and animal feeders, encouraging them to keep water accessible for strays. The activity saw active participation and helped strengthen our relationship with the community.





# AWARENESS CAMP AT GOKARAJU RANGARAJU COLLEGE

Blue Cross of Hyderabad conducted an awareness camp at Gokaraju Rangaraju College, focusing on key issues such as animal welfare, zoonotic diseases, vaccinations, and the ABC/ARV programs. The Animal Birth Control (ABC) program, aimed at humanely controlling the stray animal population through sterilization, was a central topic of the camp. Additionally, the camp raised awareness about the Anti-Rabies Vaccine (ARV) program, which helps prevent the spread of rabies by vaccinating both stray and domesticated dogs. Through these initiatives, Blue Cross of Hyderabad emphasized the importance of responsible pet ownership, disease prevention, and community involvement in ensuring the safety and well-being of animals and humans alike.



## ***“LOVE MY INDIE DOG” SHOW***

Blue Cross of Hyderabad proudly organized the “Love My Indie Dog” Show, a heartwarming event dedicated to celebrating the charm and resilience of Indian street dogs. The event brought together pet parents, animal lovers, and community members to honor our native breeds and promote the message of adopt, don't shop. With fun competitions, interactive sessions, and adoption awareness, the show highlighted the unique personalities of Indie dogs and encouraged responsible pet ownership. It was a joyful celebration of compassion, community, and the incredible bond between humans and their desi companions.



# ADOPTION DRIVES: FINDING FOREVER HOMES



As part of the ABC program, whenever a whelping mother dog is brought in for surgery, her puppies are also brought in and cared for at the shelter. These puppies are kept in a safe and nurturing environment until they reach 45 days of age, after which they are made available for adoption. Adoptions are organized on a dedicated Adoption Day held on the last Sunday of every month, helping to find loving homes for these young animals and reducing the number of strays on streets.



# VACCINATION CAMPS

## July 6, 2024 - World Zoonosis Day

On World Zoonosis Day, Blue Cross of Hyderabad organized a vaccination camp, successfully vaccinating 355 dogs. This initiative aimed to raise awareness about zoonotic diseases, which can spread from animals to humans, while also ensuring the health and safety of both animals and the community. By providing essential vaccinations, the camp not only protected the dogs from preventable diseases but also contributed to public health efforts in preventing the transmission of zoonoses.



## September 28, 2024 - World Rabies Prevention Day

On the occasion of World Rabies Prevention Day, Blue Cross of Hyderabad conducted a successful vaccination camp, where an impressive 4,415 dogs were vaccinated with the support of WVS and Mission Rabies over a fortnight leading to the event. The initiative aimed to raise awareness about the importance of rabies prevention and to ensure that a large number of dogs were protected from this deadly disease. This helped contribute to the global mission of reducing rabies deaths, promoting public health and animal welfare.



## March 29, 2025 – Geo-Tagging & Canine Vaccinations in Manikonda

A large-scale community geo-tagging, for the first time in Hyderabad and Anti-Rabies Vaccination drive was conducted in Manikonda, covering over 812 street dogs. Sponsored by W3 with strong CSR team support, the initiative aimed to create a traceable and protected dog population. Activities included public awareness sessions, water bowl distribution, and volunteer participation, promoting both animal welfare and community health.

This project is aimed to address street animal population and welfare, and marked a significant step toward expanding humane interventions for the same.

The campaign focused on rabies prevention and awareness and was timed with World Rabies Day to maximize impact. More than 4000 dogs were vaccinated across the city.

# REPORT ON PROGRESS IN VETERINARY MEDICINE AND ANIMAL HEALTH

Veterinary medicine continues to advance at a rapid pace, with developments that directly support both clinical outcomes and **animal welfare**. For practitioners, these changes provide practical tools to **reduce suffering**, improve health, and strengthen the human–animal bond, while also contributing to public health and sustainable food systems.

**Preventive medicine** remains one of the most powerful tools available. Modern **vaccines** including DNA, RNA, recombinant, and subunit platforms are replacing older methods, offering safer and more consistent protection. Marker vaccines allow practitioners to control disease while maintaining surveillance. For wildlife and free-roaming populations, **oral and bait vaccines** have proven highly successful against rabies and swine fever. **Thermostable vaccines** are especially valuable in regions with limited infrastructure, ensuring reliable immunization without dependence on cold-chain storage.

Advances in **diagnostics** allow veterinarians to make quicker, more confident decisions. Portable PCR and lateral-flow assays deliver same-day results in the field. **Next-generation sequencing (NGS)** enables rapid identification of emerging pathogens and supports epidemiological mapping. Digital platforms using AI and GIS mapping now make **real-time surveillance** possible, helping welfare-focused veterinarians anticipate risks and intervene early.

**Antimicrobial stewardship** has become central to responsible practice. Following guidelines helps slow **antimicrobial resistance (AMR)** while ensuring effective treatment when antibiotics are truly needed. Alternatives such as probiotics, bacteriophages, and immune modulators reduce reliance on antimicrobials. **Monoclonal antibodies** and biologics are providing targeted therapies that minimize side effects and preserve animal comfort.

Animal welfare itself has gained stronger recognition. Housing systems now encourage natural behaviours, and wider access to analgesics and anaesthetics ensures humane management of pain. **Precision livestock farming** technologies such as wearable sensors, automated feeders, and monitoring cameras detect illness and distress early, allowing timely intervention before suffering escalates.

The **One Health approach** reinforces the interconnectedness of human, animal, and environmental health. In practice, this means greater involvement in zoonotic disease prevention, biosecurity, and environmental health initiatives.

Looking forward, **CRISPR gene editing**, **nanotechnology**, and **telemedicine** will continue to shape veterinary care. At the same time, **climate change adaptation** including managing heat stress, vector-borne disease, and welfare risks will be increasingly vital.

For animal welfare veterinarians, the message is clear: progress in science must translate into **compassionate, evidence-based practice**. Applying these tools thoughtfully ensures animals not only live longer but also **live better**.

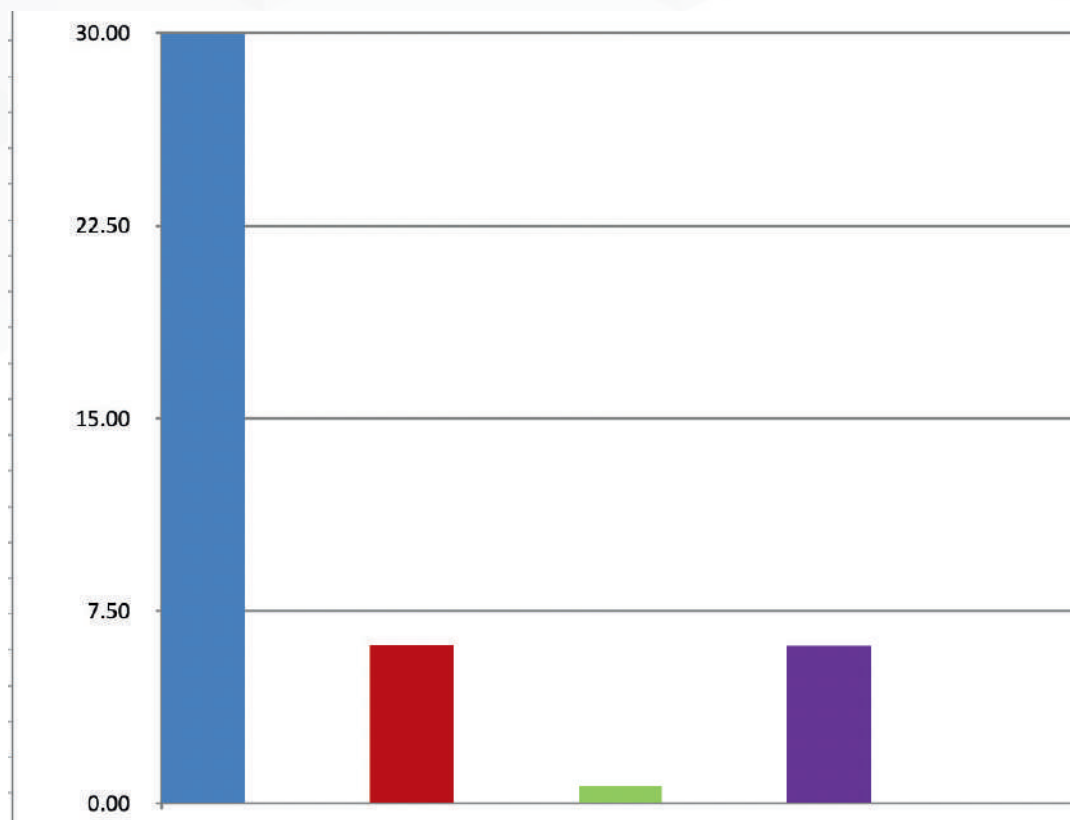

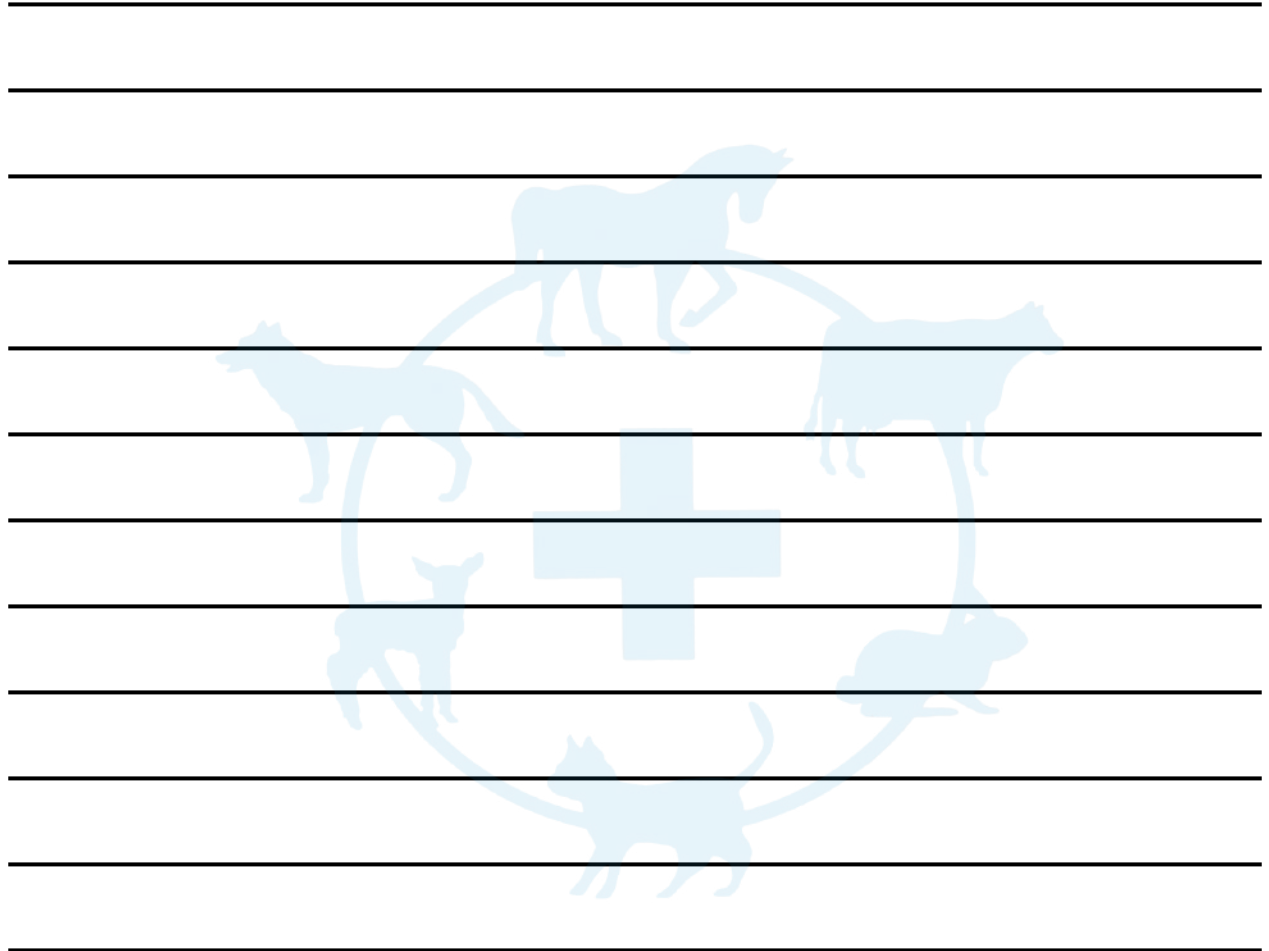
